Text: Matthew 6:19-24

Target: What defines you? What drives you? What describes you? For what defines you is where you find your identity.

1. Kingdom Values: "But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you." Matthew 6:33

Quote: Generosity is not something we do, it's who we are.

- **a.** Trinkets on Earth: Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal (Vs. 19)
 - i. Not Worn: "moth"
 - ii. Not Used: "rust"
 - iii. Not Protected: "where"

Question # 1: What's one thing you own that you really value? How might your view of that item change if you thought about it in terms of being temporary versus eternal?

Question # 2: How do you try to show love for God and others in your daily life? Is there a specific area where you'd like to grow or do more?

- **b.** Treasure in Heaven: but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal (Vs. 20)
 - i. Loving God:

 - 3. Crown of Righteousness: 2 Tim. 4:8
 - 4. Crown of Glory: 1 Peter 5:4

 - ii. Loving People:
 - 1. Godly character: 1 Timothy 4:7-8
 - 2. Discipleship: Matthew 28:18-20
 - 3. Soul Winning: Proverbs 11:30
 - 4. Radical Generosity: Luke 6:38
- Kingdom <u>Vision</u>: "Give, and it will be given to you. Good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap. For with the measure you use it will be measured back to you." Luke 6:38
 Quote: "Our lives move toward the place where we fix our eyes" Unknown.
 - a. Passion dictates Priorities: "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Vs. 21)
 - **b.** Priorities drive our Pursuits: "The eye is the lamp of the body. So, if your eye is healthy, your whole body will be full of light." (Vs. 22)
 - c. Pursuits decide our <u>Path</u>: "but if your eye is bad, your whole body will be **full of darkness**. If then the light in you is darkness, how great is the darkness!" (Vs. 23)
 - i. Wealth is more than Net Worth
 - ii. Wealth requires a Capital Perspective:
 - 1. Financial Currency, Property, Possessions.
 - 2. Intellectual Wisdom, Education, Experience.
 - 3. Relational Friendships and Family.
 - 4. Physical Holistic Health

5. Spiritual - Salvation and Discipleship.

 - ii. God can be Tested: (Malachi 3:7-10)
 - iii. You can be Triumphant: (Malachi 3:11-12)
