Title: No Way, No Sway **Text:** Matthew 1:18-25

Target: Our doubts when confronted become the place of greatest expression of

conviction.

- I. Joseph's Complication: "Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way." (Vs. 18)
 - **A.** Already Engaged: "betrothed to Joseph" (Vs. 18)
 - B. Public Embarrassment: "before they came together" (Vs. 18)
 - C. Planned Estrangement: "And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her quietly." (Vs. 19)
 - **1. Just Man:** Person of character and reputation.
 - **2. Unwilling:** Didn't follow tradition.
 - 3. Resolved: Preventing Retribution.
- II. Joseph's Consideration: "But as he considered these things..." (Vs. 20)
 - **A.** Heavenly Interruption: "Behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream..." (Vs. 20a)
 - **B.** Personal Invitation: "Saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit." (Vs. 20b)
- **III. Joseph's <u>Confirmation</u>**: "She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." (Vs. 21)
 - A. Mission Revealed: "he will save people from their sins"
 - **B.** Prophecy Fulfilled: "All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet: "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel" (which means, God with us) (Vs. 23)
 - **C.** Decision Sealed: "When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him: he took his wife." (Vs. 24)
 - 1. Married her: "took his wife" (Vs. 24)
 - **2.** Honored her: "but knew her not until she had given birth to a son. And he called his name Jesus." (Vs. 25)

Takeaway: Every encounter with Jesus requires a personal decision.
