# PASTOR MAURICE COX

Title: When My Preference Becomes My Prison

Text: 1 Samuel 16:1 NIV

Target: When we cling to our personal preferences over God's promises, we find ourselves stuck in

places we were never meant to stay.

Saul is a representation of people's preferences, not God's promise.

But the people refused to listen to Samuel's warning. "Even so, we still want a king," they said. and the Lord replied, "Do as they say, and give them a king." Then Samuel agreed and sent the people home.

1 Samuel 8:19.22 NRSV

### If I am going to break free from the prison of preference, I must...

- I. Be honest about the amount of TIME spent in my season of grief.
  - A. It's not the POSTURE of mourning that God is dealing with; It's the PERIOD of mourning that He is dealing with
    - 1. "How long..." 1 Samuel 16:1 NIV
  - **B.** Mourning is human. Mourning too long is childish.
    - Scripture calls us to lament, to feel, and to allow grief and sorrow to have their place.

### II. Remember what God TOLD me

- A. "I have rejected him from being king." 1 Samuel 16:1 NIV
- B. When things don't go our way, we tend to blame Satan for things that God is doing in our lives.
- C. "...Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God." Matthew 4:4 NIV

### III. Consistently TURN towards God, not my past.

- A. "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us." Hebrews 12:1 ESV
- B. "Now the Lord said to Samuel, "You have mourned long enough for Saul. I have rejected him as king of Israel, so fill your flask with olive oil and go to Bethlehem. Find a man named Jesse who lives there, for I have selected one of his sons to be my king." 1 Samuel 16:1 NLT
- C. "Do not say, "Why were the former days better than these?" For it is not from wisdom that you ask this." Ecclesiastes 7:10
- D. "The 'good old days' are the combination of a bad memory and a good imagination" (Warren Wiersbe)

**Takeaway:** In Christ, every ending is the beginning of something better.
