Barriers to Biblical Friendship:

Our longing for independence

Our <u>loop</u> of the past.

Biblical friendship requires:

1. Cost

a. "Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends." -**John 15:13 ESV**

2. Consistency

- a. A friend loves at all times, and a brother is born for adversity. -Proverbs 17:17 ESV
- **b.** "A man of many companions may come to ruin, but there is a friend who sticks closer than a brother." -Proverbs 18:24 ESV

3. Confrontation

- a. An open rebuke is better than hidden love! Wounds from a sincere friend are better than many kisses from an enemy. -Proverbs 27:5-6 NLT
- **b.** Whoever rebukes a person will in the end gain favor rather than one who has a flattering tongue. -**Proverbs 28:23 NIV**

4. Confidants

- **a.** Whoever goes about slandering reveals secrets, but he who is trustworthy in spirit keeps a thing covered. -**Proverbs 11:13 ESV**
- **b.** Whoever covers an offense seeks love, but he who repeats a matter separates close friends. -**Proverbs 17:9 ESV**

Covenant

a. And Jonathan made a covenant with David because he loved him as himself. -1 Samuel 18:3 NIV
